# 1. Welcome and call for agenda items - Reza

Reza noted that Ravi won't be attending today's meeting. Also, he congratulated Alex on being named a University Distinguished Professor. No items were added to the agenda.

## 2. Approval of minutes - Pat

The revised minutes of the April 8, 2016 meeting were unanimously approved.

### 3. Commencement & Other Events - Pat

Pat reminded participants that UCR has combined all grad student graduations into one Grad Student Commencement ceremony on Saturday, June 11<sup>th</sup> at 8am. BCOE's Undergrad Commencement is scheduled for Monday, June 13<sup>th</sup> at 6pm. He asked that Chairs, Graduate and Undergrad Advisors and 1-2 other faculty attend each Commencement ceremony. Faculty attendance is particularly needed for the Undergrad Commencement since there will be no hooding at this event. Reza added that Chairs should encourage grad students to attend BCOE's Undergrad Commencement. Pat noted that a BCOE Reception has been scheduled after Monday's Undergrad Commencement ceremony but the Dean's Office is not planning to hold a similar event after Saturday's Grad Student Commencement. BCOE departments can organize their own receptions after this ceremony or sometime before the end of the quarter.

The next Council of Advisors meeting is scheduled for Monday, May 2<sup>nd</sup>. There will not be a Chairs/Directors meeting that day but all chairs and directors are invited to attend the Council's lunch to meet with members. RSVP's for this lunch should be sent to Eilene.

A reception will be held the same day from 6-8pm for Reza at City Hall. This reception is being sponsored by the Mayor and Gordon Bourns. RSVP's are needed by April 25<sup>th</sup>. Spouses are welcome to attend.

A dinner at Reza's house will follow this reception. RSVP's are needed by April 25<sup>th</sup> and spouses are welcome to attend.

An Endowed Chair Reception will be held on June 8<sup>th</sup> from 4-6pm at the Alumni Center to honor the recipient of the Marlan and Rosemary Bourns Presidential Chair. Reza added that 12 outstanding BCOE faculty were nominated and that the name of a proposed recipient has been forwarded to campus for approval.

A College meeting has been scheduled for Friday, June 10<sup>th</sup> from 3-6p in WCH 205/206. This meeting will include a college reception for Reza.

Reza added that Linda Parker's Retirement event has been scheduled for May 6<sup>th</sup> from 3-5pm in WCH 443. This will be Linda's last day in BCOE.

## 4. Undergraduate Education - Sharon

Sharon reported that there were over 10,000 attendees at the recent Highlander Day. The number of freshmen SIRs in BCOE increased after this event. She gave two presentations that day to over 300 attendees in each session.

Sharon distributed a Scheduling Guideline for General Assignment Rooms. Under this Guideline, departments are limited to offering no more than 50% of their lectures/seminars and no more than 60% of lab/discussions during prime time hours of 8am – 2pm. She noted that the summaries of General Assignment and Departmental Room usage indicated that most BCOE departments conform to this guideline. Also, it was noted that general assignment classroom scheduling is done by the Registrar's Office and is outside the control of departments. In response to a question, Sharon noted that the increasing number of incoming UCR students may result in the scheduling of discussion/lab sections on Saturdays.

Next, Sharon called attention to the Undergrad Application Status Report that was also distributed. The number of BCOE freshmen SIRs increased to 257 this year from 181 at this same time last year. Sharon believes that this increase may be due to the interest generated in BCOE during this year's Highlander Day event. BCOE's freshmen target is 450 this year. It's too early to be concerned about this high number of SIRs this year. One reason for this high number of SIRs at this time is that BCOE put students on waitlists last year but this process is not being repeated this year.

Also, Banner training is continuing. All BCOE staff (and faculty) that currently use SIS will need

Also, Banner training is continuing. All BCOE staff (and faculty) that currently use SIS will need Banner training. In particular, all BCOE Student Affairs and Grad Assistant staff will need to go through 2 hour per week Banner training.

Lastly, BCOE's Entrepreneurial Committee recently met. This Committee is made up of faculty representatives from BCOE departments.

### 5. Graduate Education - Reza

Reza called attention to the Grad Student SIR status summary attached to the agenda. The deadline for PhD fellowship funding applications was 4/15/16. The number of BCOE grad student SIRs last week was 128 which is about 50% of BCOE's 243 target. Reza reminded participants that BCOE expects to hire a significant number of new faculty this year and that each new faculty member will need 1-2 grad students so departments should be prepared to provide these students.

# 6. Departmental Updates

UCLight: Albert reported that two groups recently visited UCLight including representatives from UCI. An award to UCLight is in process from the US Navy.

CE-CERT: Matt stated that about 6-7 proposals from campus researchers are being submitted to the University Transportation Center. Each proposal could be funded at \$1.5M/year. About 30-40 UCR faculty are involved in these proposal efforts.

ME: Guillermo reported that an offer was recently made to a faculty candidate to fill Javier's position. The department has approved two candidates for Cluster hires.

CRIS: Bir noted that a large proposal on Brain research was recently submitted to NIH. This involved 30-35 researchers from several disciplines across UCR.

BIEN: Bir stated that two faculty candidates are being interviewed this week and that an offer is being made to a Target of Excellence faculty candidate. This candidate is currently a UC Presidential Postdoc Fellow. Lastly, letters are coming in for three department Chair candidates.

CEE: Nosang reported that negotiations are in process with a faculty candidate to fill Mark's position and that several Cluster hire candidates are being reviewed.

CSE: Marek stated that all faculty candidate interviews have been completed. Five offers have been accepted and two more offers are outstanding. A response from a Distinguished Professor candidate is expected this week. The department expects to hire 6-7 new faculty this year.

CEN: Walid noted that he attended 32 faculty candidate interviews this year. A programming (bridge) course may be needed for CEN students.

CNSE: Robert had nothing new to report.

MSE: Ashok stated that the number of incoming MSE grad students (25) is the highest in the Program's history.

POEM: Alex reported that he has been involved in several Cluster hire searches and that an MRSEC proposal is being prepared.

ECE: Jay noted that the department's Board of Advisors meeting is scheduled for 4/19/16. Also, he noted that the department is participating in several Cluster hire efforts including a joint hire with Physics.

It was noted that input from ECE's Board of Advisors meeting will be included in the department's ABET documentation. On a related issue, it was suggested that senior survey data should be automated for departmental ABET purposes.

MSOL: Kambiz reported that 40 students are currently enrolled in MSOL this year and that 12+ are expected to enter in Summer and an additional 35+ in Fall. He stated that the campus is requiring departments to resubmit all MSOL courses since the current "v" designation for MSOL courses can't

be used in Banner. Also, it became known last week that UCR forgot to submit the MSOL Program for WASC approval. However, the Academic Senate has indicated that MSOL can continue while the campus pursues this approval.

# 7. UCPath Building – Reza

Reza stated that during a recent meeting with Maria Anguiano, she noted that space was available for UCR campus units at the UCPath Center. Reza noted that a BCOE department may want to use such off campus space for grad students or large research groups. The space available is dry lab space only. The group responded that this off-campus space would be more attractive if regular shuttle service was provided to/from UCR.

# 8. BCOE Executive Committee: Program Representation - Reza

Reza asked Chairs to encourage BCOE faculty to volunteer (or nominate other faculty) for Academic Senate Committee openings. It's important for BCOE to be represented on these Committees particularly by senior faculty. Also, since no-one has volunteered to be Chair of BCOE's Executive Committee, it might be possible to have Venky do it for another year (by exception to policy).

### 9. Other topics/New items

No other items were discussed.

# **Scheduling Guideline for General Assignment Rooms**

Prime = 8:00 am - 2:00 pmNon Prime = 2:00 pm - 10:00 pm

- A. Departments are limited to offering no more than 50% of their lectures/seminars and no more than 60% of the lab/discussions during prime time hours (8:00 a.m. -2:00 p.m.) Classes meeting on one day only and for more than normal duration (e.g., 3 hour seminars) should be scheduled in non-prime time (2:00 p.m. 10:00 p.m.) to ensure maximum space utilization for all. (Exceptions may be necessary. See Item D below.)
- B. Sections offered with starting times from 8:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. must conform to established time blocks. Established time blocks are fifty-minute classes beginning ten minutes after the hour in the Monday, Wednesday, and Friday (MWF) pattern, and eighty-minute classes beginning ten minutes after the hour or half hour (i.e., 8:10 a.m., 9:40 a.m., 11:10 a.m., 12:40 p.m., 2:10 p.m., 3:40.p.m., 5:10 p.m.) on Tuesday and Thursday (TR). The one exception to this rule is the scheduling of sections in one-hour time blocks on Tuesday or Thursday for discussions. Sections requiring non-standard hours are restricted to the non-prime hours.
- C. To minimize interdepartmental conflicts and to develop a schedule based on sound educational principles, the following guidelines will prevail: During the prime times, in order to improve space utilization, the use of general assignment rooms will require a course history with a minimum enrollment of four for graduate courses, eight for upper division courses, and twelve for lower division courses.
  - In the event of conflicts, priority will be given to the course that demonstrates the highest seat utilization based on current projections and end of third week enrollment figures for the last three terms the course was taught (not including the current quarter or summer session). Special consideration may be given when departments submit information about anticipated significant enrollment increases beyond those of the general campus.
- D. The registrar will maintain a wait list for departments that would like to offer courses during prime time in the excess of the 50% / 60% cap. These requests will be satisfied when possible on the basis of room availability, optimal utilization, and in order that the Schedule of Classes copy is received in the Registrar's Office.
- E. Schedule of sections during Wednesday 'nooner hours' is permitted for all course types. A section refers to any lab, lecture, discussion, studio class, etc.
