Chairs' & Center Directors' Meeting Minutes

1. Welcome and call for agenda items - Reza

Walid added an agenda item to discuss cooling in the High Performance Cluster Room (WCH 224).

2. Approval of Minutes - Pat

The revised minutes of the January 28th Chairs/Directors meeting were unanimously approved.

3. Department and Center Updates

MSE: Javier reported that interviews for the open MSO position for the MSE Program are being scheduled. Javier attended a lunch meeting sponsored by Mike Pazzani to discuss the upcoming RFP for NSF's MRSEC Program. About 40 people attended this meeting. The MSE Program will be hosting regular brown-bag lunch meetings which will include presentations of on-going research by MSE researchers.

BIEN: Val reported there was nothing new in Bioengineering.

CSE: Laxmi stated that the department's first faculty candidate is visiting today. His research area is Systems. A total of five candidates will be interviewed, including one female candidate.

CE: Walid reported that nothing was new with the Computer Engineering Program.

Mitch stated that February is a very heavy proposal month and that there are 24 proposals due within the next week.

EE: Jay stated that the donated equipment from B&K Precision has already arrived. EE's first faculty candidate is visiting today.

ME: Tom reported that the department did Skype interviews of 12 candidates and selected six for campus visits. One candidate has already received an offer from another institution so five will be visiting UCR. Tom indicated that doing initial interviews via Skype worked well but recommended that candidates use hard-wired internet connections (not wifi). Also, ME has received over 60 applications for its open FAO position and will start interviews soon.

On-line MS Engr: Kambiz reported that two of the Program's core courses are being offered this quarter. One course is being taught via round table discussion which required adjustments to the video recording set-up. Kambiz is working with the MSE Program and Mark Matsumoto on additional Program specializations.

4. Graduate Education/Graduate Applications - Mark

Mark distributed two handouts. The first handout compares domestic and international grad student applications, admissions offers and acceptances to date over the last three years by BCOE Program. Mark pointed out that there are four domestic and seven international acceptances so far this year. The second handout presents PhD and MS applications, admits and SIRs from AY 2010/11 to AY 2012/13 by BCOE Program. The last two sections on each side of the handout present percentages of Admits to Applications and SIRs to Admits by BCOE (MS and PhD) Program. Mark noted that the percentage of BCOE PhD SIRs to Admits declined from 49% to 43% over the three-year period. CEE's percentage of PhD SIRs to Admits declined from 50% to 21% during this period. One explanation for these decreases is the increasing quality of the applicant pools.

5. Undergraduate Education/MOU w/Chinese Universities - Ravi

Ravi distributed a handout that presents undergrad admissions data by BCOE Program. Ravi stated that a recent analysis indicates that second tier students admitted last year (based on math courses and test scores) did not perform as well as students admitted with high AIS scores. As such, Ravi stated that BCOE freshmen admissions will be based solely on AIS scores this year. The handout included two models (Logistic and "Yield Based") that could be used to reach BCOE incoming freshmen targets. BCOE can use either model. Also, Ravi noted that applicants with high AIS scores that aren't accepted into their requested BCOE Program will be offered admission to other BCOE Programs this year.

Also, Ravi stated that CS 10 now has an on-line offering (CS 10V). The "V" indicates that it's a "Virtual" course. Students will be able to enroll in either CS 10 or CS 10V. BCOE Programs that currently require CS 10 will need to vote on allowing students to take either course. In the meantime, individual exceptions can be granted. On-line offerings of CS 12 and CS 120B will also be available. Frank Vahid can be contacted for more information on these on-line courses.

Additionally, Ravi reported that there appears to be a programming bug in BCOE's course submission system. As such, the current data may not be accurate. BCOE Student Affairs will be providing this data via a back-up (manual) system until this bug is fixed.

Lastly, Ravi reported that we should be receiving student applications in April/May from the 11 Chinese universities that have formal MOUs with BCOE for the 3+1 Program (through UNEX).

6. Research Faculty Directory - Reza

Reza noted that some BCOE departments list their research faculty on their website and some departments don't. There should be consistency in listing these appointments. These appointments are titled as research engineers by UCR but can have working titles of research faculty (which is preferable). After discussion, the Chairs agreed that there should be consistent listing of these appointments in BCOE departmental directories. Reza will send Chairs and Directors a listing of these appointments along with more information.

7. Budget Proposal- Pat

Reza reminded Chairs and Directors that the Dean's Office needs their input for this year's Budget Proposal to campus. This input should stress increasing the number of graduate students, new faculty lines in multi and interdisciplinary areas and perhaps joint appointments with other UCR schools and colleges (such as the School of Medicine and CNAS). Pat added that this input should be submitted by the end of February to give the Dean's Office time to complete its budget proposal by the campus' 3/25/13 deadline.

8. Other Matters

Walid stated that the cooling system for the High Performance Cluster Room (WCH 224) isn't working and that Physical Plant estimates it will take 2-3 weeks to obtain the \$11K repair part. This means that the specialized, expensive computing equipment in this room can't be used for another 2-3 weeks since they need adequate, consistent cooling. Pat reported that Physical Plant agreed to fix the problem last year and should have completed the job by now. He will discuss the problem and possible solutions with the Director of Physical Plant.

It was suggested that Physical Plant's support of BCOE be discussed with the Interim Chancellor when she attends an upcoming BCOE Chairs/Directors meeting. Reza will let participants know which meeting she will attend.

Lastly, Reza noted that he has a meeting with the EVC/P this week and hopes to obtain feedback on BCOE's proposal to increase the number of international MS students.
