1. Welcome and call for agenda items - Reza

The Distinguished Lecture Series topic was added to the agenda.

2. Approval of Minutes - Pat

Ravi reported that the campus held its annual UC Discovery Day last Saturday for undergrads admitted to UCR. Ravi was very pleased with the turnout of BCOE faculty at this event. His presentation to these students and their parents was well attended and many good questions were asked. Also, a new BCOE website to increase BCOE's student yield rate is being finalized and should be on-line in 7-10 days. Additionally, Ravi received positive feedback from Prof. Haggerty's committee on BCOE's proposed new breadth requirements. The Academic Senate will still need to approve individual courses. CS 8, CS 180 and ME 3 are being offered this Spring. A second concentration of courses will be directed to non-technical majors at UCR. Ravi reported that applicants are being wait listed so that BCOE can reach its 600 incoming freshmen target. It was noted that UCB is targeting 20% of its incoming undergrad students to be non-residents (to increase its tuition income). Ravi's proposed distribution of undergrad workload FTE for new General Education courses that he discussed at the 2/22/10 Chairs/Directors meeting has not received any negative feedback to date at the department level. It was stressed that this proposed distribution impacts TA funding allocations to BCOE departments and should be carefully considered by departments.

6. Commencement Status - Mark

Matt reported that Robert Brown, Director of Vehicle Environmental Engineering at Ford, has agreed to be BCOE's Commencement Speaker. Mark mentioned that departments will need to develop their lists of grad students to be hooded at this year's Commencement.

7. Departmental Updates

Javier and Reza noted that Shankar has accepted the position as Dean of the College of Engineering at the University of Alabama (Huntsville) starting next Fall.

Alex reported that MSE has finished its Grad Student Manual.

Walid stated that Computer Engineering has submitted its MS proposal to Mark for review.

Victor reported that Bioengineering is taking the lead in developing a Society for the Advancement of Hispanics/Chicanos and Native Americans in Science (SACNAS) chapter at UCR and assisting in UCR's recruitment efforts at the 2010 SACNAS National Conference in Anaheim.

Tom is working on a response to the Grad Council's review of BCOE's On-line MS Engineering proposal.

Yushan stated that he has received the Academic Senate committee's draft review of CEE's graduate program. The review is generally positive. Also, he reported that there are about 20 self-supporting MS students in CEE's grad student offer queue.

Matt reported that CE-CERT's Board of Advisors meeting is scheduled for April 13th. Also, CE-CERT will hold two events on April 14th: a dedication of its Digital Environmental Library in honor of Helen Petrauskas, the late Vice President of Environment and Safety Engineering at Ford and a ribbon cutting ceremony for its new Heavy Duty Chasis Dyno. CE-CERT will also contribute to UCR's Environmental Research Institute's Sustainability Workshop on April 15th.

8. Other Matters

Mitch noted the Distinguished Lecture Series announcement attached to the agenda. Wanda Austin, CEO of Aerospace Corporation, will give the next BCOE Distinguished Lecture on March 30th at 3pm. ME is the sponsor of this Lecture so all ME faculty and grad students should be encouraged to attend. Mitch mentioned that attendance at the last two Distinguished Lectures was very good. Dr. Bhatka Rath from the Naval Research Laboratory will give the BCOE Distinguished Lecture on April 5th on "Energy After Oil." The speaker for the April 15th Lecture, Mary Nichols from the California Air Resources Board, is unable to attend so a replacement is being selected.

The area of 3D electronics is not being pursued by the MSE faculty search committee since it has been communicated to the committee that the Department of Electrical Engineering is not interested in acquiring additional faculty at this time.

In summary, as of 3/16/10, from the recommended list of candidates provided by the respective departmental ad hoc committees, 6 individuals in Biomaterials area and 11 individuals in Materials for Energy area have been discussed by the MSE faculty search committee. Of the discussed candidates, 5 are visiting campus for the Biomaterials area, and 6 for the Energy area. The MSE faculty search committee will continue to review and discuss additional applicants during the next several days to identify 4 additional candidates for campus interview in biomaterials and energy areas for the initial 15 interviews.
