

Finding the money

- Grants.gov (www.grants.gov)
 - Daily announcement. You can subscribe free. Mitch checks daily and sends summaries.
- Fed Biz Opps (www.fbo.gov)
 - Contracts, not grants: way more chaff than wheat.



Finding the money

- UCR search engines
 - Office of Research:
 - >http://or.ucr.edu
 - >Research Development
 - >Funding search engines
 - IRIS and SPIN are good.
 - GRAPES is good for graduate students and postdocs.
 - UCR intranet site: Mitch's summaries



Finding the money

- Agency-specific sites
 - NSF: www.nsf.gov/publications/obtain.jsp
 - NIH: grants.nih.gov/grants/guide/index.htm
 - USDA: www.csrees.usda.gov/fo/funding.cfm
 - NASA, DOE, others...







Process

- Most proposals are submitted by the University, not by the PI.
- Start early! Typically we need the budget, title, and partial summary 3-5 days before submission to initiate campus approval.
- Allow more time if
 - We are a subawardee.
 - We have subawardees.
 - Cost sharing is involved.
 - Teaching release time is involved.
 - Construction is involved.



Approval

- Campus approval is handled through the E-CAF system. This is easy to learn.
- The Office of Research handles final submission. Typically, the BCOE grants office packages everything for submission.
- In almost all cases, the PI does not have the authority to submit a formal proposal. You do, of course, have the freedom to discuss ideas with sponsors, and usually to submit concept papers or pre-proposals.
