

The Material Science and Engineering Program at the University of California, Riverside has a need for part-time or full-time Lecturers beginning the Fall Quarter 2021-22 academic year to teach courses in the following areas: MSE002, MSE003, MSE004, MSE161, MSE175A, MSE175B, MSE 238 and MSE 248. Minimum qualifications include MSEE or MS degree in Material Science and Engineering or related field and prior teaching experience. Preferred qualifications are a Ph.D. in Materials Science and Engineering or a related field.

Salary for Fall quarter appointment begins October 1, 2021 and ends December 31, 2021; the academic service period for Fall is September 20, 2021 through December 10, 2021.

Salary for Winter quarter appointment begins January 1, 2022 and ends March 31, 2022; the academic service period for winter is January 3, 2022 through March 18, 2022.

Salary for Spring quarter appointment begins April 1, 2022 and ends June 30, 2022; the academic service period for spring quarter begins March 23, 2022 through June 10, 2022: based on 100% annual salary of \$69,379. Appointments are eligible for renewal depending on need, funding and performance.
