### **1. Welcome – Sharon**

Sharon announced that the next meeting will be held on February 5 and will take place at the New Career Center instead of the usual place. No items were added to the agenda.

### **2. Approval of Minutes from January 8, 2018 meeting – Sharon**

The minutes of the January 8, 2018 meeting were unanimously approved.

### **3. Graduate Education – Ravi**

Ravi provided a handout with the graduate student application status as of 1/21/18. We are down 9% compared to last year. Masters might still go up a little before final, but PhD is not likely to change. PhD applications are down 8%. It was noted there could be several factors, such as the job market, an anomaly, or the political temperature in America. Ravi noted that we are using a GRE list serve and it may be that too many others are also using it and it is causing emails to be discarded without even being looked at.

Ravi also provided a handout that shows the change in foreign applications by country from Fall 2017 to Fall 2018. Some countries are down more than others. Reasons for this are unknown, but some possibilities may be political or job market as noted above. Jay also questioned whether it could be related to a high number from that country be declined in the prior year.

Sharon stated that all departments need to push for applicants from everywhere and we need to focus on a quality experience when they come as that is a great way to advertise. We also need to work on placing Masters in jobs as that is important for recruitment advertising.

#### **4. Dean's Update – Sharon**

Sharon reported that the new VCPB will be starting on February 1. He will be taking over Facilities and A&E from RED.

There is a search going for a Director of Communications for the Campus who will report to Peter Hayashida. The position will do similar things as Angela does for BCOE, but for the Campus.

#### **5. Department/Center Updates**

ME: Guillermo stated that ME has selected three candidates for their first tier of interviews and they are starting to come out. They have two more on their tier two list if needed.

ECE: Ilya stated that ECE's short list for their two cluster searches will be completed soon and they will start interviewing soon.

CEE: Charlie noted that they have several top search candidates for the Air & Water search. He also noted that Michael Zachariah's file is ready to be reviewed and voted on.

CSE: Marek stated that interviews underway for their LSOE search; three today and two were good. He noted that they have two additional ones coming. They are currently working to fill one LSOE opening, but are working on opening another position soon.

BIEN: Xiaoping noted that they have eight candidates for the one opening they have, so they need to decide on the first tier. He wants to interview four, but they committee is looking at six. Sharon suggested doing Skype interviews first with all eight to help choose the top that should come for interviews.

He also noted that BIEN received a grant to help cover the costs of their upcoming symposium.

Xiaoping noted that Dr. Vullev received a Full Bright Scholarship for next Fall.

#### **6. Additional Items**

Jay noted that the Associate Professor promotion files are complete and they are starting to focus on the Full Professors. The deadline is 2/2 for the Dean's Office.

Guillermo noted that ME staff is exceptionally busy with UCPATH actions and items. He noted that there are a lot of errors and they are difficult to figure out and fix due to limited access for his staff. He stated that quicker turnaround time is needed by the Shared Service Center (SSC) and UCPATH. Marek and Alissa reiterated the same concerns within their departments. Sharon asked everyone to keep notes of issues/complaints so they can be brought to the SSC and UCPATH meetings for discussion and review for improvement.
